Celebrate Immanuel

Most of us look forward to the Christmas season. We will celebrate as families, as a community, and as a church. So, I think it is important that we remember why we celebrate. Jesus Christ, born of virgin, came to die on the cross once and for all in order to fulfill the Father's earthly mission. Let us never forget that cross. What Jesus meant to do on the cross, He accomplished. He did not die in vain, for He left no part of His work unfinished. He did not die to condemn us but to save us. He did not even die so that we might have the ability to conquer sin. He died to conquer sin Himself on our behalf – once and for all. One death, one sacrifice, one atonement, and one cross.

This Christmas season, we will celebrate the baby lying in a manger, but who was He? Was He just the son of a Nazarene carpenter and his teenage bride? No, He was much more, for He was truly God come to earth. He was the Messiah pledged by God's covenant to deliver His people. God didn't employ a mighty angel to do the job. He didn't send a mighty army or a great warrior on His behalf. No, He decided to send Himself. For you see, our salvation was just that important. For God so loved the world that He sent His one and only Son...

He was born once in a small town called Bethlehem. As theologians would say, "the infinite linked with the infant." The One who created the universe now lies in a feeding trough where earlier in the day cattle had been dining. He came as Immanuel, God with us! Though human, He is unlike any of us. He is unique. He is the Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace (Is. 9:6). He is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, yet He did not decide to stay on His throne. Instead, He emptied Himself by assuming the form of a slave, taking on the likeness of men. And when He had come as a man in His external form, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death — even to death on a cross (Phil. 2:7-8). He came to earth for one brief period of time, and He came for one single purpose.

Sin cannot be tolerated by a holy and just God, as sin in contrary to His nature. Sin produces hostility between God and humanity and atonement is required for reconciliation to take place. In the OT the sin sacrifice was a personal, spiritual encounter with God. A sacrifice was made to satisfy God who was present in judgment and mercy. According to the Law, a blood sacrifice was required (Heb. 9:22) and this had to be repeated time and time again. But through His amazing grace God satisfied the debt of sin via the cross of Jesus Christ once and for all (Heb. 9:25-27). No longer would the sin sacrifice be required.

So, as we stand ready to celebrate the First Advent, let us be mindful of much more than a baby in a manger. May we celebrate the reason for His coming. For it is not the manger of Jesus that saves, but the cross.
