Change My Heart, O God

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me." [Psalm 51:10]

One of my favorite choruses, that we don't sing near enough, is "Change My Heart, O God." But that chorus elicits a question inside of us. Do we know what it means for God to change our hearts? Are we willing to come before the Lord with a heart that is truly in need of changing? Are we prepared to allow the Potter to mold us shape us as the work of His hand (Isaiah 64:8)?

When Nathan finally challenged him about his sin with Bathsheba, David then became a broken man before the Lord, and only then could he write the heartfelt confession we read in Psalm 51. If only we could write with such honesty. If only we could muster the courage to pour our heart out to God, emptying ourselves concerning our sin and shame, and beg Him to bring about a change in us. "A broken spirit; a broken and crushed heart, O God, You will not despise." [Psalm 51:17] But before we can come before the Lord as David did, we must be honest about two things.

First, we must be honest about who we are. Coming before the Lord humble and broken, we must acknowledge our sinful nature and need for a change in our hearts. We cannot rest on our church dedication and Christian busyness and say we have no need for a changed heart. Like David, we must desire for the Lord to work His power in our lives. We must come totally clean about our sinfulness. We must relinquish total control of our lives to the Potter, so that He might use us in a mighty and powerful way to glorify Hm and further His kingdom.

Second, we must be honest about who God is. Scripture is brimming with verses that speak of God's forgiveness, love, and mercy. But the verse that has always touched me is Luke 15:20. "And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion and ran and embraced him and kissed him." That is exactly how God approaches us when we come to Him. At the throne of grace, we do not find condemnation, but grace and mercy (Hebrews 4:16). God, the Father, runs to us with great enthusiasm and loves us even more.

Do you get it? Yes, David sinned, but he was still a man after God's own heart, and God loved him deeply. Yes,

we too are sinners, but we are still His children, and he loves us deeply.

Do you desire the Lord to change your heart today? Come before the Him today. Come and worship Him for His love and faithfulness. Come, let God change your heart.
